Joy is one of the soul's fundamental qualities. Let it once touch the heart and mind, and we can never be the same again. All right human activity can spark off a real experience of joy. We can be the athlete straining every muscle in a race; we can be the musician, artist or writer reaching up to that true inner beauty; we can be the mother giving birth to her child; we can be the political leader battling to ground a new and needed ideal, or the scientist penetrating deeper into one of the universe's mysteries. Joy can also come to us out of the blue, as it were, when we are faced with difficulty and crisis in our personal lives. Yet this sense that, deep down, all is well cannot excuse distorted human actions and relationships. It does not justify suffering, and it should certainly not be used as an alibi for inaction. Rather, it points to the fact that, whatever the human condition, the energies of transformation, the soul's innate joy and its spiritual vision and ideas are eternally present. These gifts are always available to the individual, to the group and to humanity as a whole whenever we choose to live and act according to what we know is true and just.

Joy is a special wisdom. When we touch the soul ourselves, we actually become a strand in the bridge that links humanity to the higher kingdoms. When we experience joy ourselves, we can bring this quality into the wider field of humanity's awareness.

The worldwide network of triangles is of course an important vehicle for achieving this, and many have commented on the special joy they experience as they participate in the work. So, as we do our daily triangles meditation, thinking in the heart and loving with the mind, we can know that our directed thought, winging through the channels of light that we are creating, is bringing the time of right human choice ever nearer.

The Planetary Network

The planetary network of light, love and service is transforming the mental climate of the planet, reorientating humanity to spiritual attitudes and values. Global Energy Network International

Dr. R. Buckminster Fuller stated: "There is no energy shortage. There is no energy crisis. There is a crisis of ignorance." Global Energy Network International, GENI, is an organisation with offices in Australia and America, committed to the implementation of an energy infrastructure upon the planet which will ease the world's energy crisis.

GENI promotes the idea of creating a "global Power Line Network (grid) supplementing our current oil, coal and nuclear generated power plants with renewable, non-polluting sources of power generation, i.e. hydro, geothermal, solar, wind, etc".

This concept of a global energy grid was proposed by Dr. Buckminster Fuller in 1969 and he considered it to be "the world's highest priority objective".

GENI expresses the view that there should exist a network of power transmission lines upon the planet to meet the energy requirements of all countries. During the off-peak hours of the major industrialised countries, when power demands are minimal and generators are not working at a maximum potential, power grids in other parts of the world could be supplemented. In this way the network would "allow energy to flow from where it is abundant to where it is needed".

Diagrams of the global energy grid system envisaged by GENI feature a network of triangles - representing the power grid system - superimposed upon a Dymaxian map. This map was devised by Dr. Buckminster Fuller to show minimal land mass distortion and to "display the world not as a separate East-West world, but as a connected North-South island." It is based on the division of the globe into a network of spherical triangles.

1993: A Year of Inter-religious Understanding and Co-operation

The World's Parliament of Religions met in Chicago, USA in 1893. To celebrate the centennial anniversary of this event, 1993 will be observed around the world as a year of `Inter-Religious Understanding and Cooperation'.

To mark this occasion a series of events have been arranged throughout the world in 1993. The theme - Sharing Visions of Interfaith Co-operation for the Next Century - has been chosen by four major interfaith organisations (detailed below). They have formed an International Interfaith Organisations Co-ordinating Committee to prepare a series of events in India, including a `Religious People Meeting Together' gathering in Bangalore from 19-22 August and a one-day Centennial Festival in New Delhi on August 27.

Also from 28 August to 5 September a conference will be held in Chicago by the World's Parliament of Religions and on the agenda during this period will be meetings, exhibitions and religious services.

In consciously endeavouring to approach our work with a revitalised spiritual intention, with hearts aflame and minds clear and focused, we can draw upon the reservoir of accumulated energy. Through our united effort, we can then make these abundant gifts of the spirit available to all throughout the world who are engaged in urgent, vital spiritual work-activities: artistic, economic, humanitarian, political, religious and scientific, among others.

We can further contribute by engaging in group meditation at the time of the full moons of Aries (The Festival of Easter - 6 April), Taurus (The Wesak Festival - 5 May), and Gemini (The Festival of Goodwill — World Invocation Day - 4 June).

We would be glad to let you know of any meditating groups listed with us in your geographical region. You might also consider gathering together spiritually oriented friends to meditate together. If neither of these possibilities presents itself, you can always meditate alone. By inwardly linking up in consciousness with the world group observing the spiritual festivals in meditation, you will become an active participant in this group initiative.

Among our co-workers in Triangles are to be found individuals from many spiritual traditions) Buddhists, Christians, Hindus, Jews, Muslims, together with others following different sacred paths. This also holds true for those who observe the spiritual festivals. Both creative activities unite people in common purpose) service to humanity, and in shared vision) divine brotherhood. We will want to place particular emphasis on this facet of the work in 1993, the year of Interreligious Understanding and Co-operation when, among other things, the centenary of the first World Parliament of Religions is being celebrated (28 August - 5 September). This year's Parliament will focus on strengthening the relationship between spiritual and empirical science, and will explore the highest and best possibilities for cooperative endeavour in the approaching global community of the twenty-first century. Triangles is a world service activity in which people link in thought in groups of three to create a planetary network of triangles of light and goodwill.
